

The bible reads like a classic abusive relationship.

It's starts off with that spark between the fingers. Then the male gets angry and blames it on the victim. (**Genesis**)

He beats the child, wife, or girlfriend, ("I'm going to make you suffer," "I'm going to tell my friends to rape you." (2 Samuel 12:11) (**Exodus** through **Kings**)

In **Chronicles** he starts to rethink things, and the child or wife apologizes for having angered the man. (**Job**)

By the time we get to **Proverbs**, God has calmed down. "You know I love you, don't you? I'll never do that again. Here's a pretty rainbow for you." and then in **Psalms** breaks out into song, "...because I loooooove you...".

In the **New Testament**: "I'll make you a deal. If you tell me you love my kid more than anyone else, I'll let you out of my hell."

In **Acts** through **1 John** the man lays out the ground rules on how to not provoke him.

Revelation is of course the explosive episode wherein the man accuses the victim of loving someone else, screams "if I can't have you, no one can" and in a fit of jealousy he tries to kill the victim(s) and distroys all of their things.

(Exodus 34:14)

Do you know the *Actual* Ten Commandments? Christians don't.

(Exodus 34: 14-28)

- I Thou shalt not worship any other god, for the Lord, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous god.
- II Do not make cast idols.
- III Celebrate the Feast of Unleavened Bread.
- IV The first offspring of every womb belongs to me. Redeem all of your firstborn sons.
- V No one is to appear before me emptyhanded.
- VI Six days you shall labor, but on the seventh day you shall rest.
- VII Celebrate the Feast of Weeks with the firstfruits of the harvest. Three times a year all of your men are to appear before the Lord, the god of Israel.
- VIII Do not offer the blood of a sacrifice to me along with anything containing yeast.
- IX Bring the best of the firstfruits of your soil to the house of the Lord your God.
- X Do not cook a young goat in it's mother's milk.

Then the Lord said to Moses, "Write down these words, for in accordance with these words I have made a covenant with you and with Israel. Moses was there with the Lord forty days and forty nights without eating or drinking. And he wrote on the tablets the words - The Ten Commandments. (Exodus 34: 14-28)
